



Ask Nick Serrani how he ended up working for jcpenny and he will tell you it was a process of elimination. With one older brother, District Manager for Montgomery Ward and another brother climbing the career ladder at Sears Roebuck, that left Penney's as a remaining major department store chain in 1949. Armed with a wealth of knowledge as Storekeeper 3rd Class in the Navy and a bevy of college business courses, Nick headed to Amsterdam, New York for his first assignment with jcpenny.

It was there that he met a pretty green-eyed young lady named Nancy, who worked in the "Ready-to-Wear" department, as it was called in those days. Nancy had already been working there for six years, having lied about her age at fifteen to get the job! Nick and Nancy were married on June 25th, 1950. In those years, Company policy prohibited relatives from working for the same store. Nancy was forced to quit. We have often wondered how it could have turned out for her had she been permitted to stay. The Serrani's celebrated their 60th anniversary this year.


Like his brothers, Nick earned promotions and the family began its adventure criss-crossing the country to new jcpenny stores, new challenges and always making new friends. Christmas cards still arrive each year from every spot the family lived. These assignments included Long Island, New York City, Cincinnati, Ohio, the Chicago Regional Office, DeKalb, Illinois and Richmond, Indiana.

It was not unusual for the Serrani brothers to spend the better part of long distance phone calls checking on the price of dungarees, etc.

Retired for 23 years, after working 38 ½ years, Nick had the opportunity to reminisce with his brothers who agree that they first learned about customer service working alongside their dad in his shop, Serrani the Tailor, in Rome, New York.

Nick and Nancy are proud when they see that same strong work ethic in their extended family of three married daughters, eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Travel and golf have been part of the fabric of Nick's retirement, but Community service is also an important component of life. He has served on numerous Boards in Richmond, such as the Opera Board, Park Board, Dunn-Mental Health Board, Planning Commission, Leadership of Wayne County and World Life Insurance.

Mason Dixon Group Chronicle

For most Americans the name Mason Dixon symbolizes the dividing line between two cultures, North and South. But within jcpenny circles, the name unites rather than divides.

Fifty-three members living in 16 different states compose the membership of the Mason Dixon H.C.S.C. Club. The majority reside in the six states that hover around the Mason Dixon Line: Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Jersey.


Ten retired store managers founded the Mason Dixon Group in May 1975. All had managed stores in Pennsylvania, Maryland, or Virginia. They named their group after the 233-mile boundary line that surveyors Charles Dixon and Jeremiah Mason drew up in the 18th century to settle a border dispute between the then colonies of Maryland and Pennsylvania. This famous line formed a focal point uniting these managers together.

For the last 10 years, the group has held two meetings a year, except during National Convention years. The region where group members live includes an abundance of historic and scenic locations, including cities and battle sites that have been crucial to American history. Group meetings usually are held at one of these sites. Since the year 2000 the group has gathered in 17 different locations.

The three-day meeting agendas follow a standard pattern. On the first day there is golf for the lovers of the links. Non-golfers have lunch together and then shop or tour a local site. Hospitality reunions are held each evening.

The second day always consists of an organized tour of the main attraction in the area. For example, the Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, the battlefield in Gettysburg, PA, or Thomas Jefferson's home Monticello in Charlottesville, VA. In the evening the group holds its business meeting, followed by a festive banquet. The banquet will feature a guest speaker, sometimes a still active jcpenny store manager in the area who gives a short presentation on "what's happening at jcpenny."

Bill Ceglia Volunteer of Volunteers

1927-2010

Among Mason Dixon members, one character trait appears over and over again: a generous dedication to community service. As volunteers, our members give back to their communities in a multitude of ways.

None has exemplified this more than the late Bill Ceglia, who retired as manager of the Security Square Mall store in Baltimore in 1997. Bill served as President of the Mason Dixon Group in 2002-2003 and as the club's Representative to the National H.C.S.C. from 2004 until his passing in 2010.

At his death, Bill was lauded as the "volunteer of volunteers." Both as an active store manager and as a retiree, he served many community service groups. They included the Optimists Club, the Rotary, the YMCA, Goodwill Industries, the Hugh O'Brien Youth Organization, the American Cancer Society, and the Hospice of Howard County, MD. He was also chairperson for the jcpenny Golden Rule Awards program in Maryland.



So widespread was his network of friends and associates, that a postal delivery person told him one Christmas, "You get more cards in a day than I get in five years."

It was decided that the H.C.S.C. Foundation would provide assistance. The Foundation was incorporated in California on September 20, 1960. Mr. Penney made a sizeable personal contribution. H.C.S.C. members are generous in their donations and continue to donate annually. Some members have included the Foundation in their wills. Assistance is given as determined by a Foundation Board study of each applicant's income, living necessities and medical expenses. Some applicants are in their own homes but require supplemental help in meeting basic needs. Many are in nursing homes and require extended care.
